CREATURE FEATURES

Whales come in all sizes. They range all the way from the vaquita, which is small enough for an adult human to hold in their arms, to the blue whale, which is longer than two school buses parked end to end. But no matter how big or small, all whales share characteristics that allow them to thrive in the ocean.

BRAIN

Whales can have enormous brains. Some species brains weigh some 18 pounds (8 kg)! However, that's still considered relatively small compared to body size. But there's no doubt whales are intelligent—they can learn and teach other whales what they've learned.

ROSTRUM

A cetacean's snout, beak, or rostrum is made up of the same bones as other mammals have in their snout, but in whales the nose opening is not near the tip of the rostrum, but instead on the forehead and is called the blowhole.

NECK

Except for a few cetaceans, almost all whales have very short neck vertebrae and their neck is so thick and muscular that most cannot turn their heads like humans. But rigid necks help make their bodies hydrodynamic, or able to move smoothly and quickly through the water.

Humpback whale

FLIPPERS

A whale's pectoral fins act like the rudders on a boat, helping the animal control its movement through the water. Long fins help give these behemoths more movement control as they glide through water.

BLOWHOLE

Whales breathe through one or two blowholes located on top of their heads. Millions of years ago, whales had nostril-like features at the tip of their snouts. Over many generations of whale evolution, these nostrils moved to their current position to make it easier for whales to breathe while swimming.

DORSAL FIN

This helps keep a whale stable and balanced while swimming.

A whale's **LARGE BODY** HELPS IT TRAP HEAT, keeping this warm-blooded animal from getting too chilly in cold ocean waters.

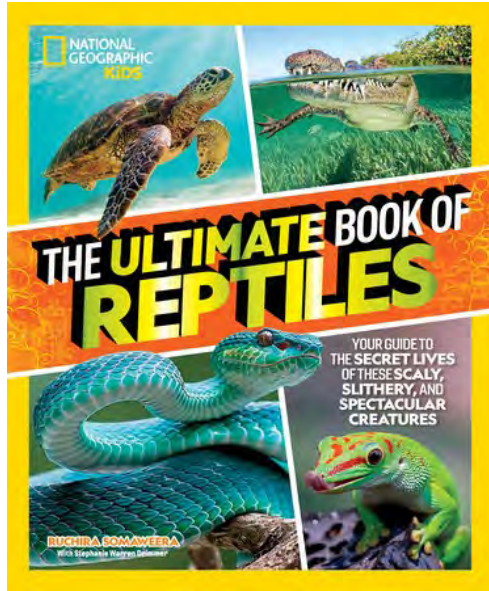
TAIL

Sometimes referred to as the fluke, the wide sides of a whale's tail do not contain bones. Instead, they are composed of tough tissue that makes the tail strong yet flexible. Whales propel themselves forward by moving their tails up and down.

BLUBBER is a layer of fat that helps keep a whale **WARM IN COOL WATER** and streamlines its body to help it **SWIM WITH LESS ENERGY**.

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Water, Salt, Air



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I LIVE IN THE SEA, BUT I'M NOT A FISH

When a whale emerges from water it breathes through a blowhole. This is an opening on the top of its head and is used to exhale the air the whale keeps in its lungs when it dives into the water.

The air expelled by the whale is hotter than its surroundings because it comes from inside the animal. This means that when the air comes out it condenses into vapour which forms a fine spray. The spray is called a spout. But rather than seeing a spout of water, what we are actually seeing is the whale's breath. Just before a whale dives into the water, strong muscles close the blowhole. The size and shape of the spout can be used to identify different species of whale, as well as other cetaceans.

The name cetacean comes from the Greek word *ketos*, which means 'whale' or 'sea monster'. It was first used by the philosopher Aristotle in his study of marine creatures that breathe through lungs. Cetaceans are mammals. They are different from fish because they breathe through their lungs, give birth to live young and feed their offspring with milk. Unlike fish they are warm-blooded, though some species of fish (such as sharks and tuna), can also warm parts of their bodies.

So, next time you look at a marine animal and you're not sure whether it's a fish or a cetacean... just look at how its tail moves!



Cetacean is the name given to a large group of aquatic mammals, consisting of whales, dolphins and porpoises. There are eighty-five species of cetacean. Almost all of them are marine animals (meaning they live in the sea), except for a few species of freshwater dolphins. These cetaceans are sub-divided into two more sub-groups: **Odontoceti** (toothed whales) and **Mysticeti** (haleen whales, which have whalebones instead of teeth).

Like fish, cetaceans move using their tail (caudal) fin, but while fish move their tails from right to left, cetaceans move their tails up and down. A whale's tail fin is connected to its spine. As we know, cetaceans are mammals, and the spines of mammals bend freely forward but have very little sideways movement. Fish are not mammals, so they are constructed differently.

The players are in place. The stage is set. Curtain up.

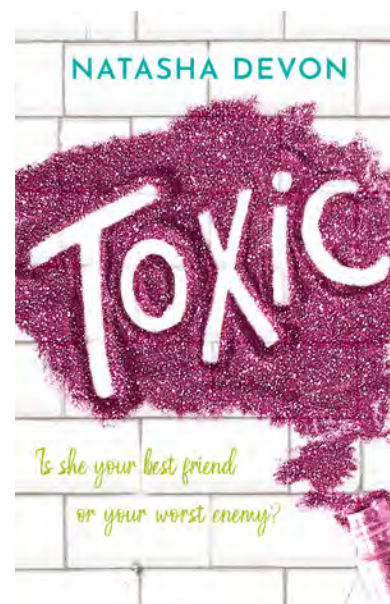
